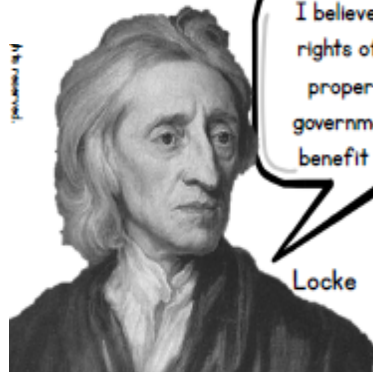


# DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE
