The Gilded Age

- Coined by Mark Twain
- gild:
- gilded:
- 1.covered or highlighted with gold or something of a golden color. 2.having a pleasing or showy appearance that conceals something of little worth

A Nation of Immigrants

- Growth of Immigration
 - By end of 19th Century, US population had tripled
 - 23.3 million (1850) → 76.2 million (1900)
 - million immigrants
 - Causes:
 - Push factors
 -, political turmoil, overcrowding, religious persecution
 - Pull factors
 - "land of opportunity"
 - Availability of industrial
- "Old" vs. "New" Immigrants
 - Southern & Eastern Europeans
 - Many and illiterate
 - Catholic, Greek Orthodox, Russian Orthodox, and Jewish
 - Non- (white, Anglo-Saxon, Protestant)
 - "birds of passage"
 - Largely retained old world customs
 - Segregated
 - "Little Italy's" and "....."

 - Contract Labor Law (1885)

 - Detention & Questioning
 - Preventing temporary workers and "paper brides"
