Description: The emphasis in this course will be to look at US History through a variety of themes and perspectives. We will look at the political, economic, and cultural development of the United States with a focus on the forces that caused the United States to change and grow. This will be a course that will require imput from everyone as we move through US History. Learning activities include reading, research, composition, reflection, \& oral presentation, in both individual \& collaborative modes. This is a rigorous course that requires students to study outside of class to be successful. This course is a requirement for high school graduation.

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All work is graded on a point system. Classwork is roughly $50 \%$ of the overall grade, with approximately $50 \%$ for tests. (The Final is worth roughly $20 \%$ of the semester grade). Grades are determined by dividing the total number of points you have achieved by the total number of points possible. Grades will be determined on a cumulative basis for the entire semester.

## PARIC/PATON POLNISE

Students receive 3 participation points each day. These points are worth roughly one grade. Points will be deducted for non-academic behavior such as low levels of participation, excessive chatting, 'phone use, eating, tardiness, profanity, classroom disruption or insubordination.

## ATHENDANCE

A. Truants - unable to make-up work assigned on that day.
B. Tardies - lose that day's participation points. Excessive tardies will result in after school detention; failing to attend detention will result in a zero for that day's work.

## MAKE UP POLKY and LATE WORK:

## Classwork

Late work (not excused absence) may be turned in for $50 \%$ credit within a week (3 classes) of the due date. Students must come to me to request submission for work more than one week late and must have a valid reason for being so late. No late work will be accepted after a grading period has passed.

## Chapter \& Unit Tests

Students must take a test within 2 classes of coming back to class. Half credit will be awarded for tests made up more than 2 classes after coming back to class.
